GETTING CHILDREN READY FOR SCHOOL

But kindergarten readiness—the critical stage at which children are prepared for learning and success—is more than a matter of age. For a strong start in school, children need positive relationships and supportive learning environments beginning at birth. At First Steps, we partner with families, caregivers, and communities to ensure that all children are prepared for success.



South Carolina's Profile of the Ready Kindergartner

Developed by SC First Steps and the SC Department of Education, the state's description of school readiness includes 60 developmental milestones across 5 categories:

CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIPS



Access to quality early care and education improves school readiness and long-term academic outcomes, and provides parents with the opportunity to work or attend school. Through First Steps and DSS-funded child care scholarships, eligible children receive tuition-free enrollment at quality child care centers.

IMAGINATION LIBRARY



As the local affiliate of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, we provide free, high-quality books to children from birth until age five, no matter their family's income.

Children enrolled in our Imagination Library program receive one book per month by mail. Each title is selected by a panel of early childhood literacy experts, who are responsible for choosing books that meet the age-specific developmental needs of young children.

LIBRARY BASED INITIATIVE



Our library programs connect librarians with child care programs and preschool classrooms, providing books, storytelling, and staff training. Our library programs are designed to promote early language and literacy skills.

NURTURING PARENTING



The Nurturing Parenting Programs are a family-centered trauma-informed initiative designed to build nurturing parenting skills as an alternative to abusive and neglecting parenting and child-rearing practices. Families can attend group-based programs, home-based programs, or a combination of group and home-based sessions.

COUNTDOWN TO KINDERGARTEN



Developed by South Carolina First Steps – and identified as a promising state practice by the National Governor's Association in 2005 – Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a home visitation program pairing the families of rising kindergartners with their future teachers during the summer before school entry. Teachers complete six visits with each family, establishing strong connections during the summer that facilitate classroom learning throughout the year.

McCormick County First Steps in collaboration with SC First Steps, with funding provided by the federal Preschool Development Grant Birth through Five Initiative hosted a back to school event for rising kindergartners. The event took place at Skate Away USA skating rink and participants received a bookbag full of school supplies, free skate admission and rental, gas cards, and kindergarten readiness handouts.





EARLY EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN UNDER 4



This program provides quality child care for infants and toddlers. We focus on the most at-risk children, especially those children with multiple risk factors and developmental delays.

We use certified child care providers, who continually increase their knowledge of early childhood development through training each year.


